## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The State Office of Risk Management (SORM) is looking for a strong leader as the Director of Enterprise Risk to directly oversee the risk management and insurance programs for the State of Texas. As the director, you will provide guidance, leadership, and expertise for Enterprise Risk Specialists in risk management and insurance. You will also be instrumental in building client relationships and maintaining stakeholder expectations. You will work closely with other SORM leaders, client entities, and vendors, and have a familiarity in Texas state law and extensive knowledge of enterprise risk management principles. Responsibilities include: helping to develop the agency strategic plan, goals, and objectives; developing policies and procedures; reviewing state guidelines, rules, and regulations; establishing priorities, standards, and measurement tolls for determining progress in meeting goals; and coordinating and evaluating programs activities. This position requires a highly motivated and engaged individual with a positive attitude, sense of community, and passion for public service.

#### ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS

Directs, develops, motivates and empowers enterprise risk team and the operations of the Enterprise Risk department, including the statewide insurance and continuity programs Directs the development and implementation of risk management and loss control programs of Texas state agencies

Oversees the reviews of state agencies' risk financing programs, including risk retention programs and risk transfer through the use of all lines of commercial insurance

Develops Enterprise Risk Management tools, practices, and policies to define, assess, treat, and report enterprise risks according to an ISO 31000 enterprise risk management framework Develops innovative strategies to promote risk management and reduce loss in client agencies

Establishes the Enterprise Risk Management architecture for the Agency and all participating agencies

Oversees the review of state agencies' risk management for compliance with state and federal laws applicable to risk management and loss control, including onsite visits

Directs the preparation of technical reports and procedures for Risk Management Program Reviews (RMPRs) and On Site Consultations (OSCs)

Oversees the analysis of loss data relating to state agencies loss control programs and provides guidance on techniques to reduce these losses

Presents information to the SORM Board of Directors

Coordinates with the Governor's Office and other state agencies on emergency and disaster recovery issues

Develops goals and objectives consistent with agency strategic plan

Promotes the agency's mission and philosophy by participating in public forums

Performs related work as assigned

Maintains relevant knowledge necessary to perform essential job functions

Attends work regularly in compliance with agreed-upon work schedule

Ensures security and confidentiality of sensitive and/or protected information

Complies with all agency policies and procedures, including those pertaining to ethics and integrity

Experience in the planning and directing of risk management, loss control, and safety programs

Experience supervising enterprise risk professionals

Skill in identifying, measuring and managing risks, developing reports and plans, and analyzing risk problems and defining and/or overseeing the implementation of the risk solutions that help optimize operations.
