Robert Crane is a Program Executive for the Institute for Homeland Security at Sam Houston State University, focusing on public sector engagements, energy security, and Positioning, Navigation and Timing (PNT). Mr. Crane retired from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in 2020 after serving as senior policy advisor on civil use of precise time and location-based services, technologies, applications, and data.
